



2008 – 2009 Local Bills

A local bill is any bill which relates to a specific geographical area, e.g., county, city, or special taxing district, as opposed to a general bill, which affects the entire State of Florida.

HB 773

Plantation Acres Improvement District is an independent special district located in Broward County. The District is governed by a five member board of supervisors elected by the qualified electors in the district. This legislation changes the designation of the governing board from supervisors to commissioners.

This legislation was approved by the Governor on June 2, 2009.

Laws of Florida Chapter 2009-251

HB 775

This bill provides for the inclusion of certain unincorporated lands within the boundaries of the City of Tamarac. It provides for an election, an interlocal agreement, residency requirements for municipal office candidates and transfer of roads and rights of way.

This legislation was approved by the Governor on June 16, 2009.

Laws of Florida, Chapter 2009, 252

HB 777

This bill provides for the Deannexation of McTier Park from the Town of Pembroke Park and the annexation of the Park into the Town of West Park.

This legislation was approved by the Governor on June 16, 2009.

Laws of Florida, Chapter 2009, 253

HB 801

This bill provides for the deannexation and annexation of a road from the Town of Davie to the municipal limits of the Town of Southwest Ranches.

This legislation was approved by the Governor on June 16, 2009.

Laws of Florida, Chapter 2009, 254

HB 1059

This bill provides for technical amendments to the charter of Central Broward Water Control District, providing for additional flood protection, rights of way, lien priority, removing archaic language, raising and revising residency requirements for qualifying for office, correction of legal descriptions of commission zones and the district as a whole.

This legislation was approved by the Governor on June 16, 2009.

Laws of Florida, Chapter 2009, 257

HB 1095

This bill expands membership of the Tourist Development Council of Broward County from nine members to eleven members. The Broward County Board of County Commissioners will appoint the additional members.

This legislation was approved by the Governor on June 16, 2009.
